This means high demand for skilled construction managers, who oversee everything from scheduling to budgeting and modeling for complex building and renovation projects. Our associate degree program will give you a strong foundation in the construction industry, from reading construction plans to communicating effectively with diverse teams. This is an excellent program for students who are driven to lead and manage others. We're the only two-year program in the region whose students earn paid co-ops at top construction companies. The co-op includes a starting wage of at least \$20/hour and access to entry-level roles of \$80,000 a year or more.
