Program Achievement Merit Awards: Several available for endowments of \$100,000 each

Automotive Program Achievement Award

The award is made annually to a graduating student in Automotive Technology who showed significant improvement in the program.

Automotive Program Leadership Award

This is awarded to a student with high ethical standards, integrity, and a sense of community.

Computer Technology Program Award for Academic Excellence

This award is given to the student who has demonstrated academic excellence in the field of Computer Technology.

Construction Management Program Academic Excellence Award

This award is given to the Construction Management student who has shown continued dedication and demonstrated excellent skill in this field. Along with an outstanding GPA, this student has demonstrated that they value education, seek knowledge, and are a leader among their classmates.

HVAC&R Award for Academic Excellence

This award is given to a student who has demonstrated excellence in academic achievement, dedication and commitment to the program, and by serving as a role model for other students.

Math and Physics Award for Academic Excellence

This award is given to a graduating student with outstanding performance in mathematics and/or physics courses.

Student Leadership Awards
